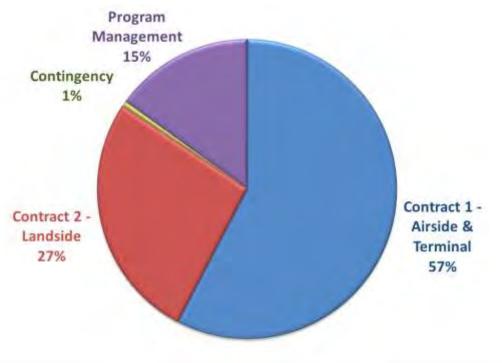

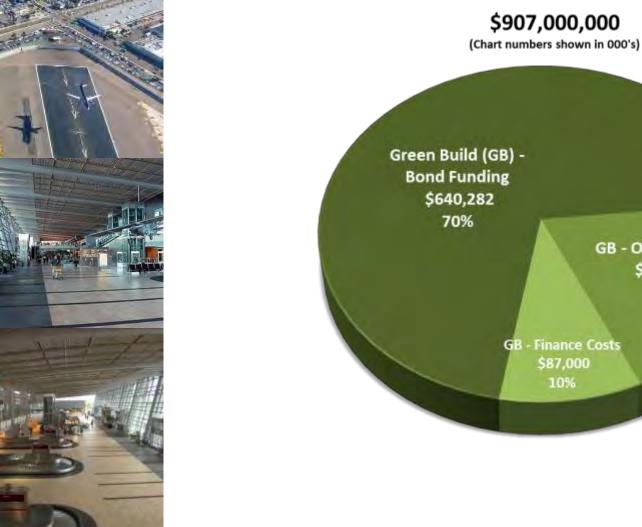

## Plan of Finance Total – Green Build As of February 28, 2014

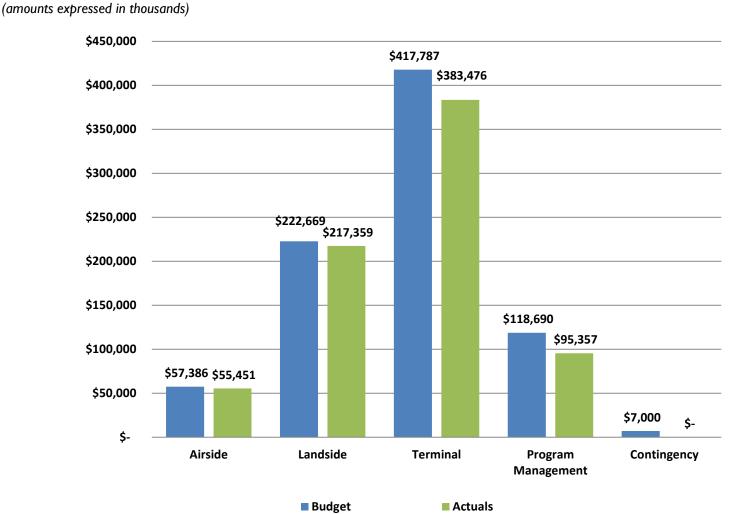

## Green Build Program by Location As of February 28, 2014

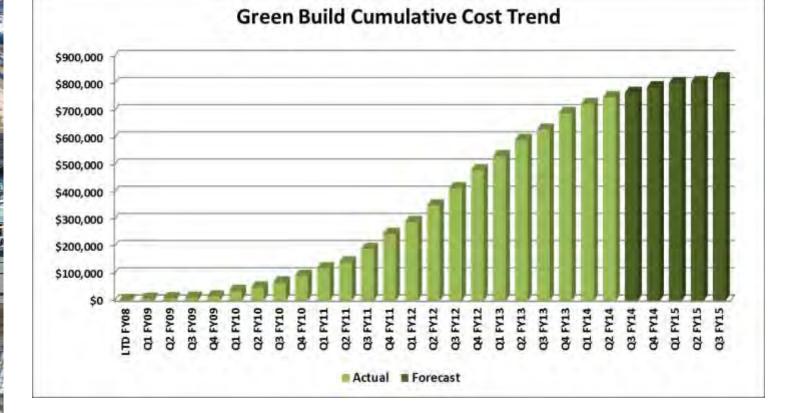






## Green Build Program Cost Trend As of February 28, 2014

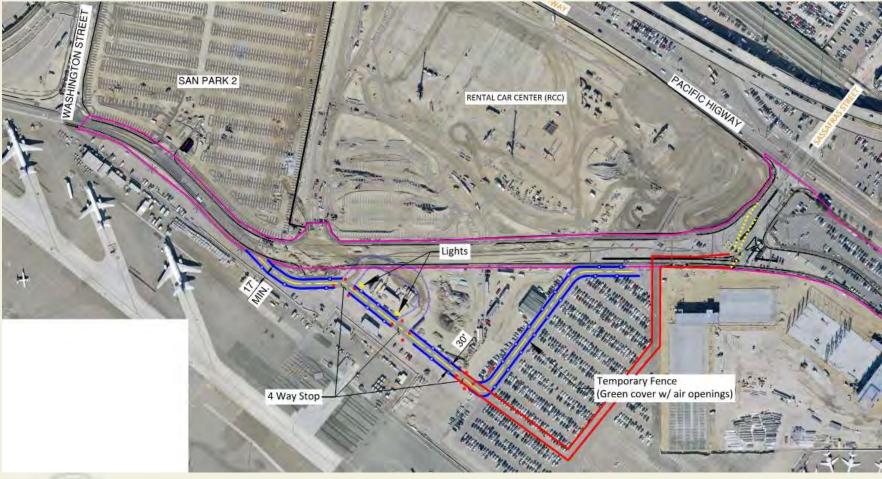
