Pursuant to §21670.3, the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority serves as the Commission.

Policy for Public Participation in Board, Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC), and Committee Meetings (Public Comment)

- 1) Persons wishing to address the Board, ALUC, and Committees shall complete a "Request to Speak" form prior to the initiation of the portion of the agenda containing the item to be addressed (e.g., Public Comment and General Items). Failure to complete a form shall not preclude testimony, if permission to address the Board is granted by the Chair.
- 2) The Public Comment Section at the beginning of the agenda is limited to eighteen (18) minutes and is reserved for persons wishing to address the Board, ALUC, and Committees on any matter for which another opportunity to speak is not provided on the Agenda, and on matters that are within the jurisdiction of the Board. A second Public Comment period is reserved for general public comment later in the meeting for those who could not be heard during the first Public Comment period.
- 3) Persons wishing to speak on specific items listed on the agenda will be afforded an opportunity to speak during the presentation of individual items. 5. CONSISTENCY DETERMINATION – SAN DIEGO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT - AIRPORT LAND USE COMPATIBILITY PLAN – ESTABLISHMENT OF AN EATING & DRINKING ESTABLISHMENT AT 1909 INDIA STREET, CITY OF SAN DIEGO:

Angela Jamison, Manager, Airport Planning, provided a presentation on the Establishment of an Eating & Drinking Establishment at 1909 India Street, San Diego, which included the Proposed Project Floor Plans; Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP) Safety Zone Location; ALUCP Safety Zone Matrix; Computation of Use Area; Occupancy Load Factor; and Safety Zone 3 Southeast.

ARSALUN TAFAZOLI, SAN DIEGO, project applicant, stated he has already invested a sizable sum of money in the project, and that the not consistent recommendation is confusing as there are many existing densely populated restaurants surrounding the proposed site. He asked the Commission to be mindful of the proposed project, and to look beyond the equation.

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Commissioner Desmond disclosed ex-parte communications with Tony Young.

Commissioner Cox disclosed that Greg Murphy of his staff had ex-parte communications with Tony Young.

Commissioner Robinson disclosed ex-parte communications with Mr. Tafazoli and his attorney.

Chair Gleason disclosed ex-parte communications with Tony Young.

Commissioner Alvarez disclosed that members of his staff had ex-parte communications with Tony Young.

TONY YOUNG, SAN DIEGO, spoke in support of the proposed project and encouraged the Commission to look at the project from a common sense approach. He also provided a letter in support of the proposed project from the Little Italy Association.

MARY GIOLZETTI, SAN DIEGO, spoke in support of the proposed project.

EDWARD BARBAT, SAN DIEGO, spoke in support of the proposed project.

In response to Commissioner Sessom regarding what options the applicant has moving forward, Breton Lobner, General Counsel, stated that if the project is determined to be inconsistent by the Airport Land Use Commission, the applicant would have to take the matter before the City of San Diego City Council and ask for an appeal. He further stated that if the proposed project is found to be consistent, the City of San Diego can grant whatever authority it wishes with regard to consideration of its zoning.

Commissioner Alvarez noted that since the proposed project is within the Civic San Diego jurisdiction, the City of San Diego would see this only if it was appealed for environmental reasons.

In response to Commissioner Desmond regarding why are projects coming before the Commission first before going to the City of San Diego, Ms. Jamison stated that the San Diego International Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP) is not yet implemented by the City of San Diego, and therefore all projects are referred to the Airport Land Use Commission until the General Plan is consistent with the ALUCP.

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In response to Commissioner Alvarez regarding why does the Commission have any vote on this matter when it does not have any discretion within the review process, Mr. Lobner stated that this is a public process and the applicant has a right to come before this Commission.

Commissioner Alvarez stated that to the extent possible, he would like to look at streamlining the project application process in the future.

Commissioner Robinson recommended that should the ALUC deem the project to be not consistent, the applicant should request an override by the City of San Diego.

Chair Gleason stated that the Authority needs to do whatever it can for the City of San Diego to help adopt its General Plan.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt Resolution No. 2015-0030 ALUC, making the determination that the project is not consistent with the San Diego International Airport - Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan.

Recommendation: Conditionally Consistent

CONSTRUCTION OF 45 ATTACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS AT 5003 IMPERIAL AVENUE, CITY OF SAN DIEGO

<u>Description of Project</u>: Based on plans submitted to the ALUC by the City of San Diego, the project proposes the construction of a 53,946 square foot building of 45 attached residential units on a property of 1.16 acres. The application was deemed complete by ALUC staff on October 29, 2015.

Noise Contours: The proposed project is located within the 60-65 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise contour. (See the attached map.) The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces:</u> The height of the proposed project structure will be 58 feet above ground level. The proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because a determination of no hazard to air navigation has been issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

<u>Safety Zones:</u> The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

<u>Overflight Notification Area:</u> The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that an overflight notification for new residential land uses be recorded with the County Recorder or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC.

Interests Disclosure: The property is owned by the City of San Diego with pending sale to Ouchi CIC, LP with Cheri Hoffman disclosed as president. The architect is William Hedenkamp of San Diego.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Based on review of the materials submitted in connection with the proposed project and the policies in the SDIA ALUCP, staff recommends

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that the ALUC make the determination that the project is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

<u>Conditions:</u> 1) Sound attenuation to an interior noise level of 45 dB CNEL. 2) Recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC.



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RESOLUTION NO. 2015-0032 ALUC

A RESOLUTION OF THE AIRPORT LAND USE COMMISSION FOR SAN DIEGO COUNTY MAKING A DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED PROJECT: CONSTRUCTION OF 45 ATTACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS, AT 5003 IMPERIAL AVENUE, CITY OF SAN DIEGO, IS CONDITIONALLY CONSISTENT WITH THE SAN DIEGO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT - AIRPORT LAND USE COMPATIBILITY PLAN

WHEREAS, the Board of the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority, acting in its capacity as the Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) for San Diego County, pursuant to §21670.3 of the California Public Utilities Code, was requested by the City of San Diego to determine the consistency of a proposed project: Construction of 45 Attached Residential Units, City of San Diego, which is located within the Airport Influence Area (AIA) for the San Diego International Airport (SDIA) Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP), adopted and amended in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the plans submitted to the ALUC for the proposed project indicate that it would involve the construction of 45 attached residential units; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project would be located within the 60-65 decibel (dB) Community Noise Equivalent Level (CNEL) noise contour, and the ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS) height restrictions and is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because a determination of no hazard to air navigation has been issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA); and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located within the overflight notification area, and the ALUCP requires recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder for new residential land uses or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC; and

WHEREAS, the ALUC has considered the information provided by staff, including information in the staff report and other relevant material regarding the project; and

WHEREAS, the ALUC has provided an opportunity for the City of San Diego and interested members of the public to present information regarding this matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the ALUC determines that the proposed project: Construction of 45 Attached Residential Units, at 5003 Imperial Avenue, City of San Diego, is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP, which was adopted in and amended in 2014, based upon the following facts and findings:

- (1) The proposed project involves the construction of 45 attached residential units.
- (2) The proposed project is located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour. The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, the residences must be sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level.
- (3) The proposed project is located outside the TSS. The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because a determination of no hazard to air navigation has been issued by the FAA.
- (4) The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.
- (5) The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder for new residential land uses or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, an overflight notification shall be recorded with the County Recorder or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC.
- (6) Therefore, if the proposed project contains the above-required conditions, the proposed project would be consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

GENERAL COUNSEL

<u>Description of Project</u>: Based on plans submitted to the ALUC by the City of San Diego, the project proposes the construction of 110 apartments in an eight-story, 128,543 square feet building over street level parking on a property of 0.74 acres. The application was deemed complete by ALUC staff on October 29, 2015.

Noise Contours: Greater than 50 percent of the proposed project is located within the 65-70 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise contour, and therefore the compatibility standards for the 65-70 noise contour zone apply. (See the attached map.) The ALUCP identifies residential uses as conditionally compatible, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level. The ALUCP requires that an avigation easement for aircraft noise and height be recorded with the County Recorder.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces:</u> The proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because a determination of no hazard to air navigation has been issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

<u>Safety Zones</u>: The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

Overflight Notification Area: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that an overflight notification for new residential land uses be recorded with the County Recorder or other alternative methods as approved by the ALUC. However, in instances when an avigation easement is required, no additional overflight notification is required.

Interests Disclosure: The property is owned by Thomas Chen and Associates of San Diego. The applicant is Alta 1919 Holdings LLC c/o Wood Partners of Irvine, whose vice president is disclosed as Brian Hansen. The architect is Carrier Johnson + Culture of San Diego. The civil engineer is Kettler Leweck

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Engineering of San Diego. The structural engineer is KPFF of San Diego. The geotechnical engineer is Geo Design Inc. of Anaheim.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Based on review of the materials submitted in connection with the proposed project and the policies in the SDIA ALUCP, staff recommends that the ALUC make the determination that the project is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

<u>Conditions:</u> 1) Sound attenuation of residential units to an interior noise level of 45 dB CNEL. 2) Recordation of an avigation easement with the County Recorder.




