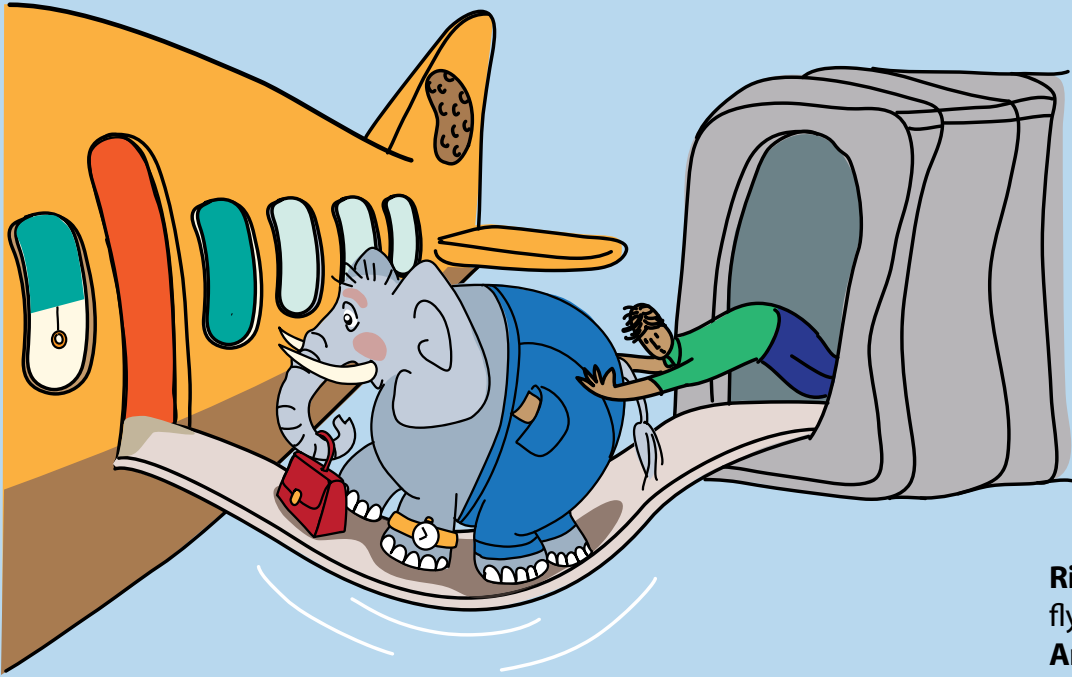


# High Flying FUN & GAMES

## Travel Games:

**Alphamag** Grab the airplane's in-flight magazine from the pocket on the seat in front of you. Find a picture in the magazine to match each letter of the alphabet. If you can not find a picture to match hard letters like X and Q, find words that contain those letters instead.

**Tall Trip Tales** Got a buddy? Start making up a story about a trip. Stop after a minute and let the other person continue. Take turns until you think it is done or you have just gotten too silly to continue!

**Stratosphere Stretch** Are you buckled in? Getting fidgety? Stretch your toes and turn your ankles without hitting the seat in front of you. Now work your way up your body. Wiggle like a worm! Can you stretch your eyebrows? When you are done, relax and take a nap or look out the window.

**Passenger Count** Without looking around and counting, guess how many passengers are sitting on your plane. Check with a flight attendant when he or she comes by to see how close you are!

**Cloud Spying** Can you see any clouds out the window? If so, look for secret shapes in the clouds! What animals can you find?
