Adjective: Describes something or somebody - examples: tidy, colorful, loud, smelly, sticky

Adverb: Tells how something is done (usually ends in "ly") - examples: quickly, clumsily, softly

Exclamation: Used to express emotion or grab attention - examples: Wow, Hooray, Yikes

Noun: Names a person, place or thing - examples: uncle, California, seat

Verb: Action words - examples: fly, skip, shout

Plural noun: Means more than one - example: ticket becomes "tickets"
