Pursuant to California Public Utilities Code §§ 21670-21679.5, the Airport Land Use Commission ("Commission") is responsible for coordinating the airport planning of public agencies within San Diego County. The Commission has the legal responsibility to formulate airport land use compatibility plans ("ALUCPs") that will (a) provide for the orderly growth of each public airport and the areas surrounding the airport within the County and (b) safeguard the general welfare of the inhabitants within the vicinity of each airport and the public in general. Pursuant to §21670.3, the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority serves as the Commission.

This Agenda contains a brief general description of each item to be considered. The indication of a recommended action does not indicate what action (if any) may be taken. **Please note that agenda items may be taken out of order.** If comments are made to the Commission without prior notice or are not listed on the Agenda, no specific answers or responses should be expected at this meeting pursuant to State law.

Staff Reports and documentation relating to each item of business on the Agenda are on file in the Board Services/Authority Clerk Department and are available for public inspection.

NOTE: Pursuant to Authority Code Section 2.15, all Lobbyists shall register as an Authority Lobbyist with the Authority Clerk within ten (10) days of qualifying as a lobbyist. A qualifying lobbyist is any individual who receives \$100 or more in any calendar month to lobby any Commission Member or employee of the Authority for the purpose of influencing any action of the Authority. Airport Land Use Commission Staff Report

Meeting Date: June 2, 2022

Report of Determinations of Consistency with Airport Land Use Compatibility Plans

Pursuant to Airport Authority Policy 8.30 and acting in its delegated capacity as the Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) for San Diego County, Airport Authority staff has issued the following consistency determinations per their respective ALUCPs.

San Diego International Airport ALUCP

Construction of Residential Unit at 4445 Cape May Avenue, City of San Diego

Deemed Complete and Conditionally Consistent on May 2, 2022

<u>Description of Project</u>: The project involves the construction of a detached, accessory residential unit with the existing residence to remain.

Noise Contours: The proposed project lies within the 65-70 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise exposure contour. The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 65-70 dB CNEL noise contour as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the residential unit is sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level. The ALUCP requires that an avigation easement for aircraft noise and height be recorded with the County Recorder. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, the residential unit must be sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level, and an avigation easement for aircraft noise and height must be recorded with the County Recorder.

Airspace Protection Surfaces: The maximum height of the proposed project structure will be approximately 199 feet above mean sea level (24 feet above ground level). The proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because the project sponsor has certified that notice of construction is not required to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) because the project is located within an urbanized area, is substantially shielded by existing structures or natural terrain, and cannot reasonably have an adverse effect on air navigation.

<u>Safety Zones</u>: The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

Overflight Notification: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that a means of overflight notification be provided for new residential land uses. In instances when an avigation easement is required, the overflight notification requirement is satisfied.

Construction of 362 Residential Units, a Hotel, and Leasable Commercial Space at 445 West Ash Street, City of San Diego

Deemed Complete and Conditionally Consistent on May 16, 2022

<u>Description of Project</u>: The project involves the construction of 362 residential units, a 60-room hotel, leasable commercial space, and underground parking on a property of 30,000 square feet.

<u>Noise Contours</u>: The proposed project lies outside the 60 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise exposure contour. The ALUCP identifies all uses located outside the 60 dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses.

Airspace Protection Surfaces: The maximum height of the proposed project structure will be approximately 462 feet above mean sea level (415 feet above ground level) and the maximum height of the proposed temporary construction crane will be approximately 500 feet above mean sea level (458 feet above ground level). The proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The proposed project would be compatible with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces, provided that the structure and temporary construction crane are marked and lighted in accordance with a determination of no hazard to air navigation issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and an avigation easement for airspace is recorded with the County Recorder. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, the structure and temporary construction crane must be marked and lighted in accordance with FAA procedures and an avigation easement for airspace recorded with the County Recorder.

<u>Safety Zones</u>: The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

<u>Overflight Notification</u>: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that a means of overflight notification be provided for new residential land uses. In instances when an avigation easement is required, the overflight notification requirement is satisfied.

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Marine Corps Air Station Miramar ALUCP

General/Community Plan Amendment, Specific Plan Amendment, and Rezone at 9363, 9373, and 9393 Towne Centre Drive, City of San Diego

Deemed Complete and Conditionally Consistent on May 2, 2022

<u>Description of Project</u>: The project proposes a general/community plan amendment, specific plan amendment, and rezone to increase the allowable development intensity for scientific research and accessory office and commercial uses and change the zoning from residential to employment mixed-use on a 3.97-acre project site. ALUC review is limited to only the plan amendment and rezone aspects of the project, and review of any development standards will be applied by City of San Diego staff pursuant to the Airport Land Use Compatibility Overlay Zone (ALUCOZ) of Municipal Code, which was found to be consistent with the MCAS Miramar ALUCP by the ALUC in 2011.

<u>Noise Contours</u>: The proposed project lies within the 60-65 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise exposure contour. The ALUCP identifies commercial, office, and research & development uses as compatible with airport uses. Development under the project must adhere to the noise compatibility policies of the ALUCP as applied through the ALUCOZ, including any standards for interior-level sound attenuation of buildings, as applicable.

Airspace Protection Surfaces: The maximum height of structures and objects, including temporary construction equipment like cranes, developed under the proposed project are limited by the ALUCP to the thresholds of applicable airspace protection surfaces such that no structure or object would constitute a hazard to air navigation, as determined by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). The ALUCP also requires that structures or objects determined to be obstructions by the FAA include marking or lighting as a condition of project approval. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, application of the airspace protection policies of the ALUCP through the ALUCOZ must ensure that structures and objects developed under the project are determined by the FAA not to be hazards to air navigation, or include marking or lighting, if determined to be obstructions. Alternatively, the project sponsor may certify that notice to the FAA is not required because the structures or objects are located within an urbanized area, are substantially shielded by existing structures or natural terrain, and cannot reasonably have an adverse effect on air navigation.

<u>Safety Zones</u>: The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

<u>Overflight Notification</u>: The proposed project is located outside the overflight notification area.
