1. Welcome and Introductions

Heidi Gantwerk, facilitator for the Airport Noise Advisory Committee (ANAC), opened the meeting at 4:00 p.m. with introductions. Ms. Gantwerk briefly shared the agenda and read applicable provisions of California Assembly Bill 361, which suspends certain requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act.

2. Roll Call

Heidi Gantwerk called a committee member roll call for attendance. Attendance is reflected on page 1. Agenda items were reviewed.

3. Awards

Heidi Gantwerk, on behalf of the Airport, presented an award to Colonel Carl "Rick" Huenefeld, who has served on ANAC for 10 years. She also introduced Jim Gruny, who will be serving on ANAC as the new MCRD representative.

4. Presentations

a. Update on Part 150

Sjohnna Knack stated that on June 3rd, 2021, the Airport Authority Board authorized staff to submit the Part 150 study to the FAA for review. Currently, we are waiting to have the FAA review the Noise Exposure Map (NEM) and once that is accepted, they will review the Noise Compatibility Program (NCP). Eventually, the Airport will receive a Record of Decision on the Part 150 recommendations.

Ms. Knack provided an update on the Noise Abatement Departure Procedure (NADP). While this item was a recommendation in the Part 150, is not something the Airport needs a specific FAA approval for. Since the FAA already has regulatory guidance on NADP, Airport staff is already reaching out and working with airline representatives.

Finally, Ms. Knack gave an update on the three flight procedures that were submitted to the FAA. The first one was to move waypoint JETTI west, so that aircraft turn even farther over the ocean and fly around the Peninsula. This was submitted several years ago, and the good news is that the FAA has set a tentative publication date of summer 2022. The FAA has acknowledged receipt of the other two nighttime departure procedure recommendations. These are the procedures that basically incorporate the FAA noise dots into a published procedure. This means that instead of FAA vectoring, aircraft should be able to follow a published departure procedure, which adheres to the FAA noise dots.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk described the new Public Comment process, and gave instructions on how to call in, into the ANAC meeting, over the telephone. There was no public comment on this item.

Questions from ANAC:

<u>Michael Herron</u> asked if there was an estimate as to how long it might take to receive the FAA feedback, on the Part 150 study. Also, what type of comments are being expected from the FAA?

<u>Sjohnna Knack</u> stated that, first, the FAA accepts the NEMs and it is not clear how long that will take. Once the NEMs have been accepted, the FAA starts to review the NCP, by sending an acceptance letter. This acceptance letter starts a 180-day period, in which the FAA has to finalize their review on the NCP. Throughout this time, Airport staff stays in-contact with the FAA, on regular basis, to receive updates on their review process. As to the type of comments that are being expected from the FAA, it is anticipated that those are likely to be about the study process, how the noise contours were created, and how the Airport involved the public in the Part 150 Study.

<u>Robert Bates</u> asked what kind of feedback, if any, the Airport has received from the air carriers, regarding the Noise Abatement Departure Procedure (NADP).

<u>Sjohnna Knack</u> mentioned that efforts are still in the early phases and it is too soon to provide any definitive data.

b. Update on Current Aircraft Noise Trends

Jim Payne started with an observation that Airport is seeing a significant increase in Stage 4 and Stage 5 aircraft use. This is attributed to retirement of older Stage 3 aircraft, but also due to new aircraft coming into the market. These changes in fleet will be incorporated into the Fly Quiet Program, which staff will present in December of 2021.

Mr. Payne gave updates on air service, including changes to international and domestic routes with airlines like Air Canada, British Airways, Swoop, WestJet, Frontier and Southwest.

Finally, he gave an update on public outreach efforts, where Noise and Quieter Home Program (QHP) staff had presented to several Realtor Associations to provide aircraft noise and QHP information and reviewed resources available to realtors to help with clients.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

Questions from ANAC:

<u>Chris Cole</u> asked for a copy of the most recent 65 dB contour map outline, especially to the east of the freeway. Staff will satisfy the request.

Anthony Ciulla offered an observation that the newer Airbus (Neo) and Boeing (Max) aircraft are significantly quieter. He also requested to confirm that the Fly Quiet Program would incorporate these newer aircraft, which was confirmed. Anthony also requested some analysis and data regarding the use of new aircraft, to be able to present at the local Community Board. Staff will satisfy the request.

<u>Paul Webb</u> asked about the use of wide-body aircraft. Jim Payne offered a methodology as to the use of such aircraft, including passenger carrying capacity, hub use frequency expansion, and use in domestic and international markets.

<u>Judy Holiday</u> asked about Midway community re-development projects and general community development procedures, and whether there is any coordination with the Airport Authority. Sjohnna Knack provided a brief overview of the Airport Land Use Compatibility Program (ALUCP) and methodology, in which zoning is used by the county, municipality and developers, as it relates to new construction and noise abatement projects.

<u>Michael Herron</u> asked to clarify the data on Early Turns over La Jolla. Sjohnna Knack confirmed that the Early Turns were decreasing.

<u>Anthony Ciulla</u> circled back to Judy Holiday's question and provided feedback. Based on his experience in completing a recent new construction project, Anthony reinforced the notion that the City development services are using very stringent and appropriate measures on new commercial and residential construction, including noise attenuation measures. Jorge Rubio, City of San Diego, also confirmed adherence to these stringent project development requirements.

<u>Celestin Fausino</u> asked a question about how individual residents could measure noise in their homes, so he could report back to his community. Sjohnna Knack said that portable noise monitoring is a part of the Part 150 recommendation, but the program is being developed and is not quite available, at this time.

C. Update on Community Sound Insulation Programs

Joshua Covell, Construction Manager, provided an update for the Airport's Community Sound Installation Programs.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

Questions from ANAC:

<u>Tania Fragomeno</u> asked if the wait list for QHP was based on the order of application signups or based on need. Joshua Covell replied that the priority was based on both, the order of incoming applications, as well as the priority based on noise impact. Sjohnna Knack added that according to California Title 21 requirements, the priority is to rank first on noise level and then length of ownership.

<u>Michael Herron</u> asked to clarify what was the limiting factor for faster project advancement, and where did the funds come from. Sjohnna Knack stated the funds come from the FAA grants and the average annual amount that is spend on QHP efforts is about \$12-14 million. Generally speaking, the pace of the program is based on the funding levels.

<u>Judy Holiday</u> inquired about which 570-unit apartment complex project was in the works, and where was it located. Joshua Covell replied that it was Loma Palisades, located on the west side of the Airport.

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

1. Welcome and Introductions

Heidi Gantwerk, facilitator for the Airport Noise Advisory Committee (ANAC), opened the meeting at 4:00 p.m. with introductions. Ms. Gantwerk briefly shared the agenda and read applicable provisions of California Assembly Bill 361, which suspends certain requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act. Procedures to submit public comments were also outlined.

2. Roll Call

Heidi Gantwerk called a committee member roll call for attendance. Attendance is reflected on page 1. Agenda items were reviewed.

3. Presentations

a. Update on Part 150

Sjohnna Knack provided an update on the Part 150 process, stating on June 3rd, 2021, the Airport Authority Board authorized staff to submit the Part 150 study, which was sent to the FAA for review, on June 10th. The Airport has received some comments on the noise exposure map, which will be reviewed and returned to the FAA.

The Noise Abatement Departure Procedure (NADP) is still in process with air carriers.

Ms. Knack gave an update on the three flight procedure amendments that were submitted to the FAA. The first one was to move waypoint JETTI further west, so that aircraft turn even farther over the ocean and fly around the Peninsula. The FAA has a tentative publication date of July, 2022, for this procedure. There were no updates on the other two nighttime procedures.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

b. Update on Current Aircraft Noise Trends

Jim Payne presented on current aircraft noise tends and stated that number of households stayed relatively unchanged, whereas the operations have increased.

He explained that the use of Stage 4 aircraft is at 25% for the current month. It is estimated that the percentage use of Stage 4 and Stage 5 aircraft is even higher than what is being reported by the Airport Noise and Operations Monitoring System (ANOMS). The discrepancy comes from ANOMS not getting current, timely aircraft stage certification updates, when air carriers implement upgrades to their aircraft. Thus, the actual use of

Stage 4 and Stage 5 aircraft is likely to be around 50%, although, some data from Southwest Airlines is still pending.

Mr. Payne discussed air service changes. British Airways has already switched to Boeing 787, with an upcoming switch to Airbus A350 (Stage 5), in the spring, 2022.

Swoop, a Canadian low-cost carrier, added new air service to Edmonton, Canada, flying Boeing 737. WestJet restarted service to Calgary. Lufthansa will be switching aircraft from Airbus A340 to Airbus A350 (Stage 5), and changing air services from Frankfurt to Munich.

Aircraft usage, in terms of Stage 4 and Stage 5 on international services look very positive. Stage 3 wide-body aircraft uses seem to be going away, completely.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

Questions from ANAC:

<u>Chris Cole</u> thanked staff for providing a 65 dB contour map, which was requested at the last meeting. Mr. Cole asked if there was a breakdown of noise complains coming from within vs. outside of the 65 dB CNEL contour, how many complaints came from homes that had been retrofitted by the QHP, and also how the complains are handled, in general.

Staff indicated that inside/outside 65 dB CNEL complaint analysis, being a new request, is quite robust and has not been previously performed. However, Ms. Knack encouraged to use Tableau website, which among many other statistics, has the complaints location information, although CNEL contour overlay is not offered in Tableau. https://public.tableau.com/app/profile/noise.disclosure/viz/SANQHPDashboard/SANQHP

<u>Judy Holiday</u> expressed that it has been more difficult to file noise complaints, after the Airport-provided 'clicker' for registering complaints had been discontinued.

Ms. Knack appreciated the frustration, and pointed out that in order for the Noise Office to be able to work with stakeholders, like the FAA and airlines, meaningful data must be subjected. The 'clicker' did not provide any relevant information, besides just registering a complaint. It is very difficult to facilitate a solution, without really understanding the problem. Ms. Knack, also provided some suggestions on how to better file 'meaningful' noise complaints, and she emphasized that the Noise Office registers and reports every single noise complaint.

<u>Paul Webb</u> expressed that the Tableau website and the complaints location map was extremely helpful.

<u>Chris Cole</u> asked further clarifying questions about third-party tools, and was informed that the Noise Office does not provide information on non-Airport registered noise complaint tools.

c. Update on Fly Quiet Program

Jim Payne started that there were no changes to the Curfew, Nose Exceedance and Fleet Quality components. However, for Stage 4 and Stage 5 aircraft use, bonus points will be added within the Curfew component of the Fly Quiet Program.

Fly Quiet Program Award Winners: Southwest Airlines (large carrier); Spirit Airlines (small carrier); FedEx (air-cargo carrier).

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

Questions from ANAC:

<u>Chris Cole</u> asked if there was any public recognition for the airlines that participated and received Fly Quiet awards. Mr. Payne explained that awards are, usually, presented at the public Airport Board meetings, however, due to current epidemiological situation, this practice was put on hold. Next year, the recognition will also be provide to the airlines at the Airport terminals.

<u>Judy Holiday</u> asked if the Fly Quiet recognition could be offered via social media, press releases or radio, and requested that the ANAC members would be informed, when those come out. Mr. Payne said that the press releases and other means to recognize airlines are likely to be implemented, next year.

<u>Anthony Ciulla</u> reiterated that a substantial reduction in noise is noticed in North Ocean Beach, with regards to Southwest Airlines flying B737 MAX.

Paul Webb, who lives inside a 65 dB CNEL contour, also stated that the change in fleet mix is very noticeable, for example when comparing new A350 and B737 MAX aircraft with old B747.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

ANAC Facilitator Farewell:

ANAC Facilitator **Heidi Gantwerk**, was admired for her years of service on the Committee with a letter from SDCRAA CEO, Kimberly Becker, ANAC members and all staff. She announced this was her last ANAC meeting as she accepted a new job.

Public Comment:

Heidi Gantwerk offered an opportunity for the Public to call-in with a public comment. There was no public comment on this item.

Meeting Schedule Discussion:

Sjohnna Knack offered for discussion 2022 ANAC meeting schedule, covering the ideas for moving ANAC from bi-monthly to quarterly meetings. Even though there was no quorum, most of the ANAC members reflected positively on the new proposed schedule.



Part 150 Update

Every meeting staff will provide an update on the Part 150 Update Recommendations.







On 6/10/21, staff submitted the study to the FAA for their review. Preliminary comments were received in December with responses returned in January.

Staff is working with the Air Carriers regarding the implementation of Noise Abatement Departure Procedure (NADP). FAA flight procedure database shows that the relocation of JETTI further west is in review for Summer 2022 rollout. FAA acknowledged receipt of the two nighttime departure procedures.






Single Event Level (SEL) comparison of different aircraft

- Weather and Mechanical issues over holidays impacted violations.
- One carrier accounted for 53% of the December 2021 violations.

CHANGES IN AIRLINE OPERATIONS & FLEET

- British Airways switching to A350 this month (Stage 5)
- Lufthansa Munich March 30 with A350 (Stage 5)
- Air Canada Multiple Markets
 - Returned with 737MAX (Stage 4)
 - Switching to Airbus A220 in May (Stage 4)
- Airline operations are at 74% of pre-COVID
- Passenger levels are at 75% of pre-COVID





Total Airport Operations (All categories) are at 70% of pre-COVID levels (2019 vs 2021) and are expected to continue to rise in 2022 with COVID seeming to wind down.

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
