Airport Land Use Commission Staff Report

Meeting Date: May 5, 2022

Report of Determinations of Consistency with Airport Land Use Compatibility Plans

Pursuant to Airport Authority Policy 8.30, and acting in its delegated capacity as the Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) for San Diego County, Airport Authority staff has issued the following consistency determination per ALUCP as indicated:

San Diego International Airport ALUCP:

Construction of Retail Sales Establishment at 3571 Pacific Highway, City of San Diego

Deemed Complete and Consistent on April 6, 2022

<u>Description of Project</u>: The project involves the construction of a cannabis retail sales establishment of 3,653 square feet on a property of 0.34 acres.

<u>Noise Contours</u>: The proposed project lies within the 60-65 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise exposure contour. The ALUCP identifies retail uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces</u>: The maximum height of the proposed project structure will be approximately 51 feet above mean sea level (24 feet above ground level). The proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because the project sponsor has certified that notice of construction is not required to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) because the project is located within an urbanized area, is substantially shielded by existing structures or natural terrain, and cannot reasonably have an adverse effect on air navigation.

<u>Safety Zones</u>: The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

<u>Overflight Notification</u>: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area, but does not involve any new residential use subject to overflight notification requirements.
