Pursuant to §21670.3, the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority serves as the Commission.

Pursuant to Airport Authority Policy 8.30, and acting in its delegated capacity as the Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) for San Diego County, Airport Authority staff has determined that the following land use actions are consistent with their respective ALUCPs:

San Diego International Airport (SDIA) ALUCP

Southeastern San Diego and Encanto Community Plan Zone Reclassifications, City of San Diego

Deemed Complete & Consistent on January 13, 2016

<u>Description of Project</u>: The project involves zone reclassifications of properties within the updated community plan areas of Southeastern San Diego and Encanto without any physical construction.

Noise Contours: The project area lies within the 60-65 and 65-70 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise exposure contours. The City General Plan Noise Element and Municipal Code implement the sound attenuation and/or avigation easement requirements of the ALUCP as applicable for residential and nonresidential land uses, with the clarification that ALUCP standards apply when they are more restrictive.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces</u>: The project area lies within the airspace protection surfaces. The City implements protection of airspace by requiring determinations of no hazard to air navigation from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) and compliance with any determination conditions for land use actions as applicable.

Safety Zones: The project area lies outside of all Safety Zones.

Overflight Notification: The project area lies within the overflight notification area. The City provides overflight notification to affected properties through the Airport Environs Overlay Zone (AEOZ).

Recommendation: Conditionally Consistent

CONSTRUCTION OF 20 DETACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS AT WOODMAN COURT, CITY OF SAN DIEGO

<u>Description of Project</u>: Based on plans submitted to the ALUC, the project proposes the construction of 20 detached residential units accessed from a new private street on a vacant property of 2.86 acres. The application was deemed complete by ALUC staff on January 28, 2016.

Noise Contours: The proposed project is located within the 60-65 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise contour. (See the attached map.) The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces:</u> The height of the proposed project structures will be 24 feet above ground level. The proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because the project sponsor has certified that notice of construction is not required to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) because the project is located within an urbanized area, is substantially shielded by existing structures or natural terrain, and cannot reasonably have an adverse effect on air navigation.

Safety Zones: The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

Overflight Notification Area: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that an overflight notification for new residential land uses be recorded with the County Recorder or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC.

Interests Disclosure: The property is owned by Woodman Court LLC of El Cajon, whose manager is disclosed as David Weiland. The developer is Infill Development Company, whose owner is disclosed as Lorraine Weiland. The architect is TRW Designs of La Mesa. The civil engineer is Polaris Development


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Consultants Inc. of El Cajon. The landscape architect is Weiland Development of El Cajon.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Based on review of the materials submitted in connection with the proposed project and the policies in the SDIA ALUCP, staff recommends that the ALUC make the determination that the project is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

<u>Conditions:</u> 1) Sound attenuation to an interior noise level of 45 dB CNEL. 2) Recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC.



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RESOLUTION NO. 2016-0002 ALUC

A RESOLUTION OF THE AIRPORT LAND USE COMMISSION FOR SAN DIEGO COUNTY MAKING A DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED PROJECT: CONSTRUCTION OF 20 DETACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS AT WOODMAN COURT, CITY OF SAN DIEGO, IS CONDITIONALLY CONSISTENT WITH THE SAN DIEGO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT - AIRPORT LAND USE COMPATIBILITY PLAN

WHEREAS, the Board of the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority, acting in its capacity as the Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) for San Diego County, pursuant to §21670.3 of the California Public Utilities Code, was requested by the City of San Diego to determine the consistency of a proposed project: Construction of 20 Detached Residential Units at Woodman Court, City of San Diego, which is located within the Airport Influence Area (AIA) for the San Diego International Airport (SDIA) Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP), adopted and amended in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the plans submitted to the ALUC for the proposed project indicate that it would involve the construction of 20 detached residential units; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project would be located within the 60-65 decibel (dB) Community Noise Equivalent Level (CNEL) noise contour, and the ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located outside the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS) height restrictions and is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because the project sponsor has certified that notice of construction is not required to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA); and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located within the overflight notification area, and the ALUCP requires recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder for new residential land uses or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC; and

WHEREAS, the ALUC has considered the information provided by staff, including information in the staff report and other relevant material regarding the project; and

WHEREAS, the ALUC has provided an opportunity for the City of San Diego and interested members of the public to present information regarding this matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the ALUC determines that the proposed project: Construction of 20 Detached Residential Units at Woodman Court, City of San Diego, is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP, which was adopted in and amended in 2014, based upon the following facts and findings:

- (1) The proposed project involves the construction of 20 detached residential units.
- (2) The proposed project is located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour. The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 60-65 dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, the residences must be sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level.
- (3) The proposed project is located outside the TSS. The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because the project sponsor has certified that notice of construction is not required to the FAA because the project is located within an urbanized area, is substantially shielded by existing structures or natural terrain, and cannot reasonably have an adverse effect on air navigation.
- (4) The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.
- (5) The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder for new residential land uses or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, an overflight notification shall be recorded with the County Recorder on each property containing a residential unit or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC.
- (6) Therefore, if the proposed project contains the above-required conditions, the proposed project would be consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

Recommendation: Conditionally Consistent

CONSTRUCTION OF 21 ATTACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS AT 525 HAWTHORN STREET. CITY OF SAN DIEGO

<u>Description of Project</u>: Based on plans submitted to the ALUC, the project proposes the construction of 21 attached, residential condominium units on a property of 0.58 acres. The application was deemed complete by ALUC staff on January 28, 2016.

Noise Contours: The proposed project is located within the 70-75 and 75+ decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise contours. (See the attached map.) The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 70-75 and 75+ dB CNEL noise contours as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level. The ALUCP requires that an avigation easement for aircraft noise and height be recorded with the County Recorder.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces:</u> The height of the proposed project structures will be 42 feet above ground level. The proposed project is located within the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The maximum allowable height for a project on this site is approximately 123 feet Above Ground Level (AGL), and the structure is approximately 42 feet AGL. Therefore, the project complies with the TSS. The proposed project would be compatible with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces, provided that the structure is marked and lighted in accordance with a determination of no hazard to air navigation issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

<u>Safety Zones:</u> The proposed project is located within Safety Zone 2 East – Uptown. (See the attached map.) The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within Safety Zone 2 East – Uptown as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the project complies with a density of 58 units per acre. The project proposes 21 units and would be allowed 34 units on a 0.58 acre site; therefore, the proposed project complies with the Safety Zone 2 East – Uptown.

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Overflight Notification Area: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that an overflight notification for new residential land uses be recorded with the County Recorder. However, in instances when an avigation easement is required, no additional overflight notification is required.

Interests Disclosure: The property is owned by 525 Hawthorn Street, LLC, which is disclosed as Stephen and Michelle Parker of San Diego. The developer is Citymark Communities, LLC, whose agent is disclosed as Richard V. Gustafson of San Diego. The architect is The McKinley Associates, Inc. of San Diego. The civil engineer is Michael Baker International of San Diego. The landscape architect is McCullough Landscape Architecture of San Diego.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Based on review of the materials submitted in connection with the proposed project and the policies in the SIDA ALUCP, staff recommends that the ALUC make the determination that the project is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

Conditions: 1) Sound attenuation to an interior noise level of 45 dB CNEL.

- 2) Marking and lighting in accordance with FAA standards.
- 3) Recordation of an avigation easement with the County Recorder.





A RESOLUTION OF THE AIRPORT LAND USE COMMISSION FOR SAN DIEGO COUNTY MAKING DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED PROJECT: CONSTRUCTION OF 21 ATTACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS ΑT 525 **HAWTHORN** CITY OF SAN STREET. DIEGO. IS CONDITIONALLY CONSISTENT WITH THE SAN DIEGO INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT - AIRPORT LAND USE COMPATIBILITY PLAN

WHEREAS, the Board of the San Diego County Regional Airport Authority, acting in its capacity as the Airport Land Use Commission (ALUC) for San Diego County, pursuant to §21670.3 of the California Public Utilities Code, was requested by the City of San Diego to determine the consistency of a proposed project: Construction of 21 Attached Residential Units at 525 Hawthorn Street, City of San Diego, which is located within the Airport Influence Area (AIA) for the San Diego International Airport (SDIA) Airport Land Use Compatibility Plan (ALUCP), adopted and amended in 2014; and

WHEREAS, the plans submitted to the ALUC for the proposed project indicate that it would involve the construction of 21 residential units; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project would be located within the 70-75 and 75+ decibel (dB) Community Noise Equivalent Level (CNEL) noise contour, and the ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 70-75 and 75+ dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level and that an avigation easement is recorded with the County Recorder; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is in compliance with the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS) height restrictions and would be compatible with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces provided that the structure is marked and lighted in accordance with a determination of no hazard to air navigation issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA); and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located within Safety Zone 2 East – Uptown, and the ALUCP identifies residential uses located within Safety Zone 2 East – Uptown as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the project complies with a density of 58 units per acre; and

WHEREAS, the proposed project is located within the overflight notification area, and the ALUCP requires recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder for new residential land uses, but does not require an additional overflight notification where an avigation easement is required; and

WHEREAS, the ALUC has considered the information provided by staff, including information in the staff report and other relevant material regarding the project; and

WHEREAS, the ALUC has provided an opportunity for the City of San Diego and interested members of the public to present information regarding this matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the ALUC determines that the proposed project: Construction of 21 Attached Residential Units at 525 Hawthorn Street, City of San Diego, is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP, which was adopted and amended in 2014, based upon the following facts and findings:

- (1) The proposed project involves the construction of 21 residential units.
- (2) The proposed project is located within the 70-75 and 75+ dB CNEL noise contour. The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 70-75 and 75+ dB CNEL noise contour as compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level and that an avigation easement is recorded with the County Recorder. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, the residences must be sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level and an avigation easement must be recorded with the County Recorder.
- (3) The proposed project is located within the TSS. The maximum allowable height for a project on this site is approximately 123 feet Above Ground Level (AGL). The maximum height of the proposed project is approximately 42 feet AGL. The proposed project would be compatible with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces, provided that the structure is marked and lighted in accordance with a determination of no hazard to air navigation issued by the FAA. Therefore, as a condition of project approval, the structure shall be marked and lighted in accordance with FAA procedures.
- (4) The proposed project is located within Safety Zone 2 East Uptown. The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within Safety Zone 2 East Uptown as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the project complies with a density of 58 units per acre. The project would be allowed 34 units for the 0.58 acre property, but only proposes 21 units.

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- (5) The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires recordation of an overflight notification with the County Recorder for new residential land uses, but does not require an additional overflight notification where an avigation easement is required.
- (6) Therefore, if the proposed project contains the above-required conditions, the proposed project would be consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the ALUC finds this determination is not a "project" as defined by the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), Cal. Pub. Res. Code §21065, and is not a "development" as defined by the California Coastal Act, Cal. Pub. Res. Code §30106.

Recommendation: Conditionally Consistent

CONSTRUCTION OF 12 ATTACHED RESIDENTIAL UNITS AT VOLTAIRE STREET AT CAPISTRANO STREET. CITY OF SAN DIEGO

<u>Description of Project</u>: Based on plans submitted to the ALUC, the project proposes the construction of 12 attached residential units within two stories above underground parking on a vacant property of 0.47 acres. The application was deemed complete by ALUC staff on January 28, 2016.

Noise Contours: The proposed project is located within the 65-70 decibel Community Noise Equivalent Level (dB CNEL) noise contour. (See the attached map.) The ALUCP identifies residential uses located within the 65-70 dB CNEL noise contour as conditionally compatible with airport uses, provided that the residences are sound attenuated to 45 dB CNEL interior noise level. The ALUCP requires that an avigation easement for aircraft noise and height be recorded with the County Recorder.

<u>Airspace Protection Surfaces:</u> The height of the proposed project structure will be 40 feet above ground level. The proposed project is located within the SDIA Threshold Siting Surface (TSS). The maximum allowable height for a project on this site is approximately 69 feet Above Ground Level (AGL), and the structure is approximately 40 feet AGL. Therefore, the project complies with the TSS. The proposed project is in compliance with the ALUCP airspace protection surfaces because a determination of no hazard to air navigation has been issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA).

<u>Safety Zones:</u> The proposed project is located outside all Safety Zones.

Overflight Notification Area: The proposed project is located within the overflight notification area. The ALUCP requires that an overflight notification for new residential land uses be recorded with the County Recorder or other alternative method as approved by the ALUC. However, in instances when an avigation easement is required, no additional overflight notification is required.



<u>Recommendation</u>: Based on review of the materials submitted in connection with the proposed project and the policies in the SDIA ALUCP, staff recommends that the ALUC make the determination that the project is conditionally consistent with the SDIA ALUCP.

<u>Conditions:</u> 1) Sound attenuation to an interior noise level of 45 dB CNEL. 2) Recordation of an avigation easement with the County Recorder.




