











Q1 Lead with most competitive industries



Most growth & job creation will come from innovation-based industries

Innovation-based industries where San Diego excels—life sciences, technology, aerospace, and defense—produce San Diego's leading exported goods and services and attract the majority of foreign investment into the region. Supporting the internationalization of firms in these industries will grow quality jobs in San Diego.

Q2 Leverage binational assets to attract investment



Capture investment along entire value chain in priority industries



Cali Baja is home to the world's largest medical device cluster

Cali Baja can house the entire value chain for advanced industries within an hour's drive. At a time of significant global supply chain disruption, the region can capture market-seeking foreign investment by showcasing its \$2.5B cross-border supply chain and facilitating opportunities for binational expansion.

Prioritize market access for small businesses



Small businesses create most jobs but face higher barriers to internationalization

Small businesses employ 60 percent of San Diegans—nearly double the national average. Companies that export are more resilient and employ more people. Facilitating access to overseas customers and markets for small businesses will enable sustainable, quality job growth.



O4 Invest in critical infrastructure



Modernize, maintain and expand service through international ports of entry

Supply chain resilience, business expansion, and tourism recovery all rely on maintaining, modernizing, and expanding air, sea, and land ports of entry. Supporting the retention of international air and liner service will augment trade and investment goals.



O5 Enhance San Diego's global identity



Deepen public-private partnerships on focused international activity
