#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

#### 1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the minutes of the April 17, 2025, regular meeting.

ACTION: Board Member Martinez moved approval of staff recommendation. Board Member Sanchez seconded the motion, which carried unanimously

### 2. NEW TERMINAL 1 CONSTRUCTION, BAGGAGE HANDLING SYSTEM, AND FINANCE UPDATE:

Bob Bolton, Director, Airport Design & Construction, Brian DeLaura, Airline Technical Representative, Airport Design & Construction, Josh Spoon, Project Manager, Airport Design & Construction, and John Dillon, Director, Finance and Risk Management, provided a presentation that included New Terminal 1 Project Timeline and Milestones;

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Terminal and Roadways Update; New Terminal 1 Arrival Road; Baggage Handling System (BHS) Commission Status Update; New Terminal 1 Campus-wide Logistics Plan; and a Financial Update, including Contingency Use Summary.

### 3. **NEW TERMINAL 1 ART PRESENTATION:**

Tiffany Beres, Manager, Arts Program, presented an overview of New Terminal 1 public art, including the relocation of *Time Interwoven* by Christie Beniston and *Sandcast* by Charles R. Faust. Newly installed works include Amy Ellingson's *A Day in the Sun*, Nova Jiang's *Torrey Pines*, Edwin Redl's *Vessel of Light*, Matthew Mazzotta's *Rise*, and Walter Hood's *Migration*, each designed to enrich the traveler's experience.

### 4. SMALL BUSINESS UPDATE:

Craig Ruiz, Manager, Small Business Development, delivered a comprehensive presentation emphasizing initiatives to create economic opportunities for small businesses in collaboration with the Authority. His presentation outlined the certification process, outreach objectives, key program highlights, and the current status of efforts supporting small business engagement.

### 5. ORAT ACTIVATION & OPENING UPDATE:

Brenden Reed, Senior Director, Operational Planning & Readiness, presented Phase 1a Activation & Opening plans for the new 950,000 sq. ft. terminal, highlighting key features such as 13 security lanes, 66 ticket counters, 53 kiosks, 19 gates, and 17 concessions. The terminal will facilitate the relocation of six airlines and 1,800 employees. He also covered the SAN ORAT process, readiness strategies, and transition planning.

#### 6. NEW TERMINAL 1 GRAND OPENING EVENTS:

Sabrina LoPiccolo-Kane, Manager, Marketing, presented an overview of the exciting lineup of events planned to celebrate the upcoming Grand Opening. The celebration will kick off with the Employee & Tenant Event on September 10, from 1:00 to 6:00 p.m. The festivities continue with an invite-only Gala Evening on September 12, from 5:30 to 9:30 p.m. On Sunday, September 14, the Community Open House welcomes the public from 9:00 a.m. to noon to explore the new space and engage with staff. Later that same day, from 2:00 to 5:00 p.m., community members are invited to experience a hands-on Passenger Simulation, giving them an inside look at operations and services. Rounding out the celebrations, the Open Day Media Event will take place on September 23, at 10:00 a.m., providing media representatives with exclusive access and insights into the new facility.



- Overall, NT1 building and PAX processing systems functioned as designed and tested










### NT1 Campus Wide Logistics Plan


